Meet Suzette Broennimann, a Clerical Assistant at Stormonth Elementary. Suzette joined the Stormonth staff as the Health Room Assistant in December 2015, and became a clerical assistant this school year.

She wears another hat, that of Mom – to two children in the district. Her daughter Lola is a 7th grader at Bayside Middle School and her son Sawyer is a 4th grader at Stormonth. We had a chance to catch up with Suzette to ask her a few questions.

What is the best part of having your kids so close to your work?

"I love having one of my kids at Stormonth, and I will miss Sawyer when he transfers to Bayside next year. I was able to eat lunch with him on a



regular basis, help him when he got hurt, or get an extra hug when I pass him in the hallway. We often carpooled to school and were able ride bikes on nice days. Also a perk, now that I'm in the office, I never forget to turn in his permission slips!"

What do you like best about your job?

"I knew I would love working in the school environment, but I underestimated how much. I find so much joy in working with the kids and helping them do just about everything. There are things I never thought I would be doing! The things I love most about my job were not listed in the job description. It is never a dull moment around here. These kids make me laugh out loud on a daily basis. And the assemblies, musicals and programs often bring me to tears. The staff here is amazing. As a parent, I already knew it was a special place. We moved from Bay View 5 years ago and fell in love with Stormonth five minutes into our school tour. Working here gives me a whole new perspective on the time and dedication our teachers put into their classrooms. I can appreciate their commitment on a different level. They are truly the best. Overall, it really has been a perfect fit for me both personally and for my family. Working with kids who love being in school and who are generally so full of positive energy is very fulfilling. To say my day goes by quickly is no exaggeration. One of my favorite benefits though, I never thought I would have a job where I had summers off!

Tell us one thing very few people know about you.

I was a Flight Attendant in my former life. I flew for Midwest Airlines (Midwest Express when I started) for about 14 years. I started right after I graduated from UW- Eau Claire in 1996. I also trained Flight Attendants

for eight of those years. It probably is a good reason why I can remain calm in stressful situations. I have travelled a good deal around the country and to some far away places including Thailand, Ireland, Hungary, Italy and Belize. It is also where I met my husband 20 years ago!
