Letter from Robert Kobylski

As I sat down to compose this last newsletter of the 2017-2018 school year, my reflections on the year soon crystallized into a theme—we have had another highly successful year at Fox Point-Bayside School District. The best news came when our District Report Card was released early in the school year. Once again, I

am proud to re-share the news that on this high profile statewide assessment measure, our students significantly exceed expectations. Fox Point-Bayside schools academic performance exceeds the academic performance of schools in the North Shore and around the state in most of the test comparisons. I don't think I'm exaggerating when I say the scores associated with most of our achievement data far and away surpass those of other schools.

As a perfect "bookend" to the year, we learned recently Stormonth Elementary was named a Title I School of Recognition for High Achievement. As one of twenty-five schools in the state to receive this award, this accolade added further validation to the level of success we have come to expect.

When examining our long track record of success, we must attribute our stellar results, first and foremost, to an excellent instructional staff. I know of no other school system in the state where you will find a more professional, knowledgeable, and caring teaching staff. Our paraprofessionals and support staff do a tremendous job supporting instruction and are truly dedicated to our district mission. I am proud of our district and school administrators as well as our supportive Board of Education. As you probably have surmised, I have been saving the biggest accolades for the group who deserves it most... our families. We have the best 4K-8 student body in the state, and it is obvious how seriously our students approach their education. When our

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students come to school prepared to learn, day in and day out, we know our parents have already done much of the heavy lifting. There are many fingerprints on our blueprint for success, and we should all be proud.

While we must certainly celebrate and even revel in our accomplishments, we must continue to look ahead and prepare our students for an ever-changing world. Now is not the time to rest on our laurels or accept the status quo. Our children deserve a progressive educational system, one that adheres to a continuous improvement model.

As we assess our needs and plan for the years ahead, we know that the \$950,000 operational referendum approved by district residents in 2015 expires at the end of the 2018-19 school year. The referendum funds have allowed the Fox Point-Bayside School District to maintain instructional programs, class sizes, and effective operations that the community has come to expect.

In the coming months, the administration will make a recommendation as to the annual dollar amount and the number of years for the next operational referendum to supplement the district budget in the years ahead. As we engage in this budget process, it is imperative that we maintain open dialogue with the community. I look forward



to a conversation about continued excellence in our district.

Again, thank you for a great school year. We are truly appreciative of the opportunity to help your student(s) grow academically.
