SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM TIMES

The FPBS Summer Pathways will run two sessions of summer school opportunities where students may participate in session one only, session two only, or both sessions! Children are welcome to repeat a course they took last summer, but course content will be similar to the current offerings. Teachers will use the same class content for both session one and session two. Please be mindful of this when making your child's selection. Some classes have prerequisites or special requests. Again, please read course descriptions carefully.

Each child may enroll in four (4), fifty-five minute classes per day based on course availability. *Please note that the transitional courses in Session 1 classes (Bayside Mentors and Movin' to Middle School) run for two consecutive class periods. You will be asked to pick alternative class choices when you register, in case your first choice is no longer available.

ELIGIBILITY

Any student currently enrolled in public, private or parochial school having completed grades K-7 (entering grades 1-8 in the 2020/2021 school year) is eligible to participate.

DISTRICT STATUS

A resident student is any student who currently attends Stormonth Elementary School or Bayside Middle School or who lives within the Fox-Point Bayside School District boundaries. Students who do not live in the district may enroll if room permits and upon payment of program fees as listed.

PROGRAM FEES

Non-Resident Students	\$150 per student per session plus individual course fee.

Full payment of course fees, plus any additional materials fees, <u>must</u> be submitted prior to the start of the Summer School Program on June 22, 2020. Summer School Program fees should be paid online using your Infinite Campus Portal account; for families who do not attend FPBS schools during the current school year please contact Mindy Makinster at <u>mmakinster@foxbay.org</u>. Fees will be invoiced with your course schedule confirmation.

Fees will not be prorated due to absence or refunded due to withdrawal from the program.

REGISTRATION

Registration booklet will be available for review on February 18, 2020. An electronic copy of the registration form will be sent via email to families on Tuesday, February 18, 2020. <u>Online registration will open Monday,</u> <u>February 24th</u>. Hard copies of the course descriptions will be distributed at parent teacher conferences.

NOTE: Register for courses based on the grade your child will be entering for the 2020-21 school year. Please read the descriptions carefully before completing the course registration through the IC portal link below. Be mindful of the grade bands. Most courses are offered to both 1-4 and 5-8 grade bands.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Online registration will close at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, March 20, 2020. Courses will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Non-resident registrations will be received after this date only if there are seats available in the class. A non-resident registration form will be posted on the district website on March 21, 2020. <u>Please</u> note, you will be asked to define alternate course choices, should your choice be unavailable.

CONFIRMATION OF COURSES AND SCHEDULE

You will receive confirmation of your child's schedule by no later than Friday, May 8, 2020. You will receive a schedule and an invoice for course fees at this time.

ATTENDANCE

All students enrolled in the Summer Pathways Program are expected to attend classes on a regular basis. Please contact the Stormonth Summer School Office (414-247-4103) to report an absence.

PROGRAM POLICIES

The Fox Point-Bayside School District Summer Pathways Program utilizes all school district rules and policies, including behavior, conduct, and cell phone use. These guidelines must be maintained to support effective programming. TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is not provided for resident students. Parent carpools are strongly encouraged and have proven to be very effective in reducing traffic congestion. Transportation will be provided for students in the Chapter 220 program.

DROP OFF and PICK UP

Please <u>drop off</u> all children in the back (west side) of the building. Enter in the SW driveway and pull up to the sidewalk along the back of the school (along the cafeteria windows) no earlier than 7:50 am. Please make sure children are exiting on the passenger side of the car and step onto the sidewalk, rather than the parking lot. If you arrive after 8:05 or there is no Summer Pathways staff visible at drop off, please drive your child to the front circle drive and bring him/her to the office for check in. Pick up will start at 11:55. Please be mindful of the summer staff and their time and <u>arrange for timely pick up.</u> All late pick ups will need to report to the front office.

FPBS SUMMER PATHWAYS PROGRAM COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Course Descriptions- Specific Grade Levels

* Fired Up for First Grade for students currently attending K5 programs, going into 1st grade

** Movin' to Middle School is offered for students currently attending 4th grade, going into 5th grade and is a 2 class period offering

*** Bayside Mentors is offered for students students currently attending 7th grade, going into 8th grade and is a 2 class period offering
**** Classes that require a prerequisite

REMINDER: Register for courses based on the grade your child will be going into.

<u>***Bayside Mentors (\$10)</u>- Eligible: students currently attending 7th grade, going into 8th grade (2 class periods)

Wanted: Compassionate students who are interested in being part of the 8th grade Student Mentor Team. By participating in this session, you will learn the many facets of becoming an 8th grade mentor, such as helping other students work through conflict, giving tours of the building, assisting 5th graders with adjusting to middle school, and being ready to take a leadership role in your last year at Bayside. Character building activities will be an important and meaningful part of this training. To participate, please request an application and teacher recommendation form from Mrs. James.

*Fired up for First Grade - Eligible: students currently attending K5 programs, going into 1st grade

This course is designed to support current kindergarten students who are making the transition to first grade in the fall. Students will work to reinforce the core concepts and basic skills learned throughout kindergarten that will help them succeed in first grade! In literacy students will participate in a variety of activities to help bolster their phonics skills, review and solidify sight word recognition, and prepare them for first grade reader's and writer's workshops. In math students will practice counting skills, addition and subtraction strategies, and work with story problems. We will also get creative and our hands dirty with some fun and interactive arts and crafts projects!

<u>**Movin' to Middle School - Eligible: students currently attending 4th grade, going into 5th grade (2 class periods)</u>

This class is designed to acclimate 4th grade students to the middle school environment. Students will learn more about the different parts of the building, how to manipulate their locker combination, and learn study skills to help them be successful 5th graders on day one of middle school. Course Descriptions for Students entering Grades 1-8 in the Fall of 2019

**** Classes that require a prerequisite

<u>****Advanced Cinematography (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 5-8 only</u>

<u>Students must have previously taken the Notebook to Film course sometime in the past</u>. Advanced Cinematography will go deeper into lighting, camera placement, transitions, framing, effects, shot continuity within a scene and music that make movies so powerful. All students will have an opportunity to work as a Director, Camera Operator, and various Grips.

****Advanced EDITING HOUR (\$5) Eligible: students entering grades 5-8 only

<u>Students must have previously taken the Pathways Press course sometime in the past</u>. Editing Hour will go deeper into the building of the Pathways Press newspaper and the editing process it takes to bring it all together.

Board 'em Busters (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Do you love to play cards or board games? Discover games that will stretch your mind and challenge your brain. Students will develop strategies in communication, problem solving, and critical thinking skills. Students are encouraged to bring in and share their favorite game as well.

Bon Voyage (\$5) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

This is a class where students will explore cities around the world through video, games, art, and food. Sydney Australia, Phuket, Thailand Naples, Italy and Paris France are just a few of our destinations. Students will fill in passports, drawing flags of countries, and journaling about what they learned on their voyages.

Building Stories with LEGOs (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Bring your stories to life with LEGOs! This course takes a hands-on approach to narrative writing, using LEGO's story-starter kits as inspiration. Students will explore the writing process and stretch their imaginations to create stop-motion stories told through film. This class puts a new spin on the good old-fashioned game of make-believe.

Chess for Champs (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Whether you love chess or have never played it before, this is the class for you! This class helps you understand and learn the game of chess. Learn about the pieces, moves, and strategies used in the ever-popular game of chess. Who knows? You may have what it takes to be a chess champ!

Circuit Training (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Discover your love of running by participating in this highly active walking/running club over the summer. This summer class offers students of all ages the opportunity to engage in regular physical activity each day while having fun! Students will partake in running adventures to build endurance and get them moving toward healthy activity levels. Please have your student wear tennis shoes and bring a water bottle.

Culture and Cooking Around the World (\$10 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and 5-8

Would you like to explore foods, cultures and traditions from a region or country in our world? This is your opportunity to prepare a traditional recipe and learn about the culture from that particular region/country. Fiction, non-fiction and technology resources will be used to research and learn about the different areas of interest.

Disc Games (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Students will work through a skill progression to develop frisbee throwing and catching capabilities. Students will then apply their skills in multiple games from Disc Golf, Disc Bowling, Disc Bocce, Disc Baseball and Ultimate Frisbee. Frisbees will be provided, but feel free to bring your own!

Engineering, Steering, and Rolling (\$15 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and 5-8

This course is a fun way to practice science, math and engineering through play! Join us as we work together to deepen our understanding of concepts such as speed, angles, slopes, collisions, and kinetic & potential energy all while playing with Hot Wheels cars, marbles and Pinewood Derby cars!

Friendship Soup (\$5) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

If friendship were a soup, what ingredients would be in it? Respect? Honesty? Communication? Trust? Kindness? Conflict resolution? Empathy? What does it mean to "build" a solid friendship with someone else? This class will use children's literature and hands-on activities to explore the many aspects of relationship-building that are essential for success. Through readers theater, students will work together to demonstrate what specific "friendship traits" look and sound like in everyday life scenarios.

From Notebook to Short Film (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Students will work to develop a Short Film. Students will learn about views on subject matter, character development, empathetic traits, authenticity of script, character flaws, lessons learned, inciting incidents and plot twists, and character secrets and best time to reveal them. Students will spend time creating a storyboard, rehearsing, producing, and editing, and of course having a Film Festival. Skill lessons will include transitions, proper use of tripods and cameras, camera Point of View, special effects (including green screen), sound and video editing and publishing of film.

Garden Art and Digging in the Dirt (\$15) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Do you have a passion for digging in the dirt, planting a colorful array of flowers, or creating something special for your garden? If so, consider cultivating your interest with this gardening class and enjoying a

spectacular setting while doing so. Class will be held in the Stormonth Courtyard, weather permitting. No need to pack a bag; sunglasses, sunscreen, and a hat are all you need.

History Fun (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Would you like to explore your favorite history topics? Would you like to play fun, interactive history games? Would you like to use Google Expedition Virtual Reality Goggles to explore different areas of history and the world? Would you like to create your own Google Expedition? This course will have students investigate and explore their favorite history topics and create cool ways to share their findings. Students will play different social Studies related games online or by gameboard. Students will interact with different Social Studies topics through games and Google Expedition Virtual Reality. Students will also create their own Virtual Reality tour an area of interest! Students will have fun with History in this class!

Jewelry Making (\$15 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Interested in creating your own masterpieces of unique jewelry? This is the class for you where you will get to bead or string your way to unique bracelets, necklaces, rings, earrings, or anklets. Create customized, stylish jewelry ready for you and your friends to wear! Be your own jewelry designer where you can choose your own colors to make one-of-a-kind pieces! You can make simple bead necklaces and bracelets, Elsa inspired necklaces, super cute Pony beaded necklaces, and bracelets out of T-shirts. Grades 1-4: not only will we bead bracelets and necklaces but we will also make wooden bracelets out of Popsicle sticks, splattered paint pendants and friendship bracelets. Grades 5-8 will also try their hand at macrame bracelets. Come join us and let your creativity run wild!

Kid Cuisine (\$10 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

This class is designed for those who love to make food! Students will incorporate their writing skills into writing recipes. This class is about food groups and measuring, all while making kid friendly foods and learning about healthy snacks. Everyone gets the opportunity to be a chef!

Math Mania (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

This will be a class filled with math games and activities. We will make math fun by playing interactive math games that get you moving and involved while practicing math. Games will have students learning to work independently. They will also work with groups as they play games to practice and challenge math skills. Students will also be able to read children's books that include math concepts. This will get them involved with activities related to the book. Math skills practiced will vary depending on the age and level of the students.

Mindfulness (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and 5-8

Mindfulness is maintaining a moment-by-moment awareness of our surrounding environment, as well as our thoughts, feelings, and bodily sensations through a gentle, nurturing lens. When we practice mindfulness, our thoughts tune into the present moment rather than rehashing the past or imagining the future. This course will include daily mindfulness practice such as guided meditations, and experiences that utilize the senses such as mindful listening, tasting and smelling. Journaling and mindful movement such as yoga will also be explored! Students will get crafty and make items that can help them in their individual mindfulness practices.

Origami Paper Folding (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Impress your family, friends, (and you) with a new skill! Have fun creating magical animals, airplanes, flowers, fish, (and more), with papers, folds, and flips. You will come away with a colorful collection of paper decorations, toys, cards, and gifts!

Painting and Printing from A-Z (\$10 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Have you ever painted a picture with Ice...or with a Dinosaur...or even with a Zipper? Come and create some unique pictures with some "everyday" objects! Students will create pictures using everyday objects from A-Z ie apples, bubble wrap, cups, dinosaurs, etc.

Paper Mache Beasties (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Would you believe that you can create small, fun creatures out of newspaper, paper tubes, masking tape, plaster strips, paint, and googly eyes? Find out how with this creative and crafty class.

Pathways Press (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Have you always dreamed of being a reporter? Well, here is your chance! Amazing things are happening all around Summer Pathways, and this is your opportunity to help document them! Student reporters will investigate all the fun activities and learning throughout Summer Pathways' courses. Students will conduct interviews, take photos, take a field trip to Bayside's Movin' Middle School and Bayside Mentors classes to gather information first hand. Then they will write articles to share with an audience through a new publication called Pathways Press.

PE Games (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

The focus will be on teamwork, sportsmanship, and safety skills while we will play a wide variety of creative Physical Education games. This adventure of recreational fun will provide plenty of non-stop action for all kids. Please bring a water bottle and wear PE shoes.

****Readers Theater (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

<u>Please note that this course is a 19 day class and runs through both session 1 and session 2</u>. Sink your teeth into summer by creating your own stories and skits based off of your favorite stories or a new story! Develop reading fluency by exploring famous authors and acting out your favorite scenes! Who needs costumes, props, or a set when you have a creative imagination?

Scrap-booking Fun (\$15 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Come ready to use your imagination to create unique scrapbook pages that will capture and preserve fun memories to last for a lifetime! Students will learn and practice scrapbooking tips and techniques to make their personal pictures and memorabilia really tell a story. Please bring your own printed pictures and other items you may want to include, such as ticket stubs, ribbons, awards, etc

Sports Frenzy (no fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Do you love sports? Sports are a great way to build valuable skills that will benefit all facets of life. Sports Frenzy will emphasize teamwork, sportsmanship, and rule-following through competitive team sports. Sports will include basketball, kickball, soccer, and flag-football. It is going to be tons of fun!

STEM Challenges (\$10 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Use your creativity and science skills to solve problems and engineer designs - all while exploring great books! From a paper airplane cargo challenge to Peep catapults and more, you'll be introduced to authentic problems through children's books then work independently or with others to come up with possible solutions. Science, Technology, Engineering and Math will take center stage as you brainstorm solutions, revise, retest, and reflect on your process. Come have fun AND grow your brain every step of the way!

Summer Adventures (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4

This course is designed to help students forget the stress of the school year with some good old fashioned fun! Your child will participate in a variety of activities in athletics, the arts, science and games, all while having fun, making friends and creating lifelong memories.

Super Science (\$5) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Students will explore scientific ideas through a variety of fascinating hands-on experiments that help bring the exciting world of science to life. They will learn interesting science facts by experimenting with different materials that react in surprising ways. This course will also give students the opportunity to make-and-take some experiments.

Weaving Wonder (\$5 fee) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Learn all kinds of techniques weaving yarn on a loom. Students will work on a small project such as a keychain to learn the basics and then move on to a larger project. Larger projects projects include making 1-2 wall weavings (a rectangle first and then a circle if time permits).

Zumba ® Kids (\$5) Eligible: students entering grades 1-4 and grades 5-8

Students will learn kid-friendly dance routines based on original Zumba[®] music and choreography. They will have the opportunity to engage in games and cultural activities to demonstrate key elements of teamwork, leadership, focus, coordination, self-confidence, and creativity.
