1. Welcome and call to order

a. Call to order: 9:05 AM

2. District Report (Dr. Jeff Dellutri)

a. The district is working hard to fill staffing shortages

3. Stormonth Report (Laura Witkov)

- a. The FAC committee met this morning and discussed funds allocation.
- b. Gift cards gathered by the PTO were distributed over break to district families in need.
- c. COVID19 Update: COVID numbers are updated by the district nurse on the dashboard on Tuesdays and Fridays. Right now 3.5% of students and 8.8% staff have tested positive. Staff shortages are a struggle as we try to stay in person. COVID mitigation strategies are in place.
- d. School Musical update: on March 16 and 17, we will present the spring musical, which will be The Grunch. Auditions are this week and next.

4. Bayside Report (Jodi Hackl)

- a. COVID Update: Eight staff members are currently out. Staffing shortages are serious but currently manageable. Right now 6.6% of the students and 13.1% of staff have tested positive.
- b. Cancellations of extra curriculars: Boys Basketball is trying to get a few games in, but many other schools have canceled outright for January. Camp MacClean retreat for 7th graders was also canceled. The 8th grade Washington DC trip is still scheduled to be open to fully vaccinated students (booster not required at this point).
- c. Students who are out for quarantine have a personalized experience some are not working if they don't feel up to it, some keep up with Google Classroom, some have quick zoom meetings with teachers. Some subjects are exempt like gym, art, and science labs.

a. Please send anecdotal stories about the gift card distribution for the next newsletter.

6. VP School Services (Jesse Hillstrom)

- a. We need a volunteer for the Bus Rider program for next year
- b. Walking to school / school safety Jesse is considering proposing a low-key safety day activity to remind the children about safety walking to school. Laura shared an email

from the Fox Point Chief of Police about safety at Stormonth. Without sidewalks, crosswalks and signage can't be installed. Crossing guards: The village does not have funding for hiring staff, and staff shortages are already a problem in other communities. Parent and staff volunteers are a possibility, but the village would not be involved. Volunteers cannot stop traffic or step in the road due to state law.

11. Past President (Megan Smith)

- a. Membership Toolkit: The website continues to be updated and populated
- b. Fund Allocation Committee
 - i. The FAC met with Stormonth this morning and allocated \$5900 of the \$8100 total for the following projects:
 - 1. Wiggle chairs and weighted vests for one K5 and one 1st grade classroom as a pilot to test effectiveness with wiggly children
 - 2. Earth Ambassadors program for K5 (kale garden, composting, recycling)
 - 3. Specials will receive funding for collaborative programs for 1st and 4th grades, like the Folk Festival
 - 4. Supplies for Market Day which is part of the third grade classroom economy program. We will purchase supplies for all kids to make their items in school rather than at home.
 - 5. Two virtual field trips for 4th grade: an archeologist specializing in Wisconsin effigy mounds, and a Fort Ticonderoga virtual field trip
 - ii. The FAC meets with Bayside FAC tomorrow. Functional space concerns seem to be at the forefront
- c. Scholastic Dollars: current balance is \$8,651
