## 1. Welcome and Introductions

## 2. Fox Point Bayside Educational Foundation (Rachel Weinberg)

a. Annual Trailblazing Beyond the Classroom Fundraiser will be on March 10 at 6PM. It will be at the Audubon this year and will include a casino, a silent auction, animal experiences. Tickets will be $\$ 90$ per person. Tickets are available for purchase now. They are looking for sponsorships and silent auction donations.
b. The Foundation has formed a partnership with the Ability Center - This organization provides children with the opportunity to experience a disability through activities like a wheelchair gym class.

## 3. Stormonth Report (Laura Witkov)

a. Thank You to the PTO for the Scholastic Book fair and Holiday donations of over $\$ 2,500$ per school and Kinder Date Night
b. New school counselor - Gregg Neuburg works at both schools
c. Ice skating update - it's still too warm for the ice rink, but we are hoping to have the ice skating unit this winter.
d. K4/K5 registration - On January 17, online registration will open. This year we will put up banners on our fences to let the public know. Our enrollment has been up for the past few years.
e. Musical - This year's spring musical will be Frozen. It will be performed in March.
f. 24-hour response for emails: teachers' stress level is managed by not needing to respond to emails immediately. They have a 24-hour window to reply and do not need to respond to emails on weekends.
g. Volunteer sign up - please ask again for parent volunteers.
h. Conferences - Laura will poll parents to see if they want to do in-person or virtual conferences this spring.
i. Gillian Heise updates on Library:
i. New outward-facing book shelves have been purchased and set up with a $\$ 3000$ allocation from the FAC.
ii. Gillian would love to get author visits funded by the PTO as well, maybe a $\$ 4,000$ - \$5,000 budget? The Jason Reynolds author-visit was very successful. Manh Le will be visiting in November. The PTO will consider how to best support the library in this way.

## 4. Bayside Report (Jodi Hackl)

a. Conferences will be fully virtual
b. Camp McLain coming up next week January 18-20. There will be scholarship money to help families who need it.
c. MAP testing will take place for the next 3 weeks
d. The all-school assembly before break was very fun
e. Band-Choir-Orchestra concerts - The 7th and 8th grade concert was in December and was phenomenal. The 5th and 6th grade concert is on Thursday January 12 at 7:00
f. The Bayside library is currently hosting a Wisconsin Historical Society walk-through exhibit about the struggle to gain voting rights for all citizens during the civil rights era. This exhibit was funded by FAC. This year there will be three more exhibits that teach about women's suffrage, the underground railroad, and one on a war.
g. FAC also funding the DC scholarships for 8th graders. $\$ 2000$ went towards partial scholarships, \$500 each to 4 children
h. 8th grade Junior Knights will take place on January 31 any student going to Nicolet should attend. The bus leaves school at 11:30. If students are not going to Nicolet, they can go home at that time. Enrollment deadline was 12/17/22 (you can still enroll), on February 1 kids start signing up for classes.

c. Club's Choice: every year we are seeing declining participation. The bulk of the money came from three families. Shipping costs were prohibitive, and the quality of the products was disappointing, particularly the food items. We might shift to a direct-ask campaign, or we could focus more on increasing membership. We would shoot for $\$ 6000$ replacement fundraising opportunity.
