I hope you are enjoying the recent changing weather and the coming of the spring season! Here are some updates of PTO financials since last quarter.

On the fundraising side, the PTO has received \$441 from the Amazon Smile program and \$103 from Box Top. Thank you for contributing to the PTO when you shop on various websites and purchase groceries. We hope you find it convenient to submit your grocery receipts using the Box Top app. Don't hesitate to contact us if you have any questions regarding this process.



Thanks to district families' generous donations, we have received \$948 from the Holiday gift campaign and this amount has been delivered to the schools to help the families in need during the past holiday season. The year-to-date donations from the wonderful Kohl's volunteer program has reached \$921. The current total membership dues collected is \$6352. We plan to offer more convenient credit card purchase options through the PTO's new website.

On the program side, the current net income from the Bayside activity night is \$634. The school picture day has brought in \$2,578. The PTO has successfully sponsored the Spring teacher conference and the Random Acts of Kindness Day for both schools.

FAC Committee (by Megan Smith, Past President)

Both the Bayside Middle and Stormonth Elementary Schools' FACs (Fund Allocation Committees) have been busy approving a wide variety of grants aimed at spending \$16,200 in extra funds brought in by the PTO last school year. As a reminder, this money was that raised above and beyond the amount promised and budgeted to the schools for spending during last school year, and it was divided equally (\$8,100 each) between the two schools for distribution this year. Teachers and staff submitted grant proposals to the FAC at each school, made up of the school Principal, a staff representative, two parent representatives, and myself as the PTO representative.

At Bayside Middle School, functionality seems to be the theme of this year's approved grants. From improving the large, often-used Multipurpose room with a sound system and two adjustable height long workbenches, to purchasing an extensive laundry list of small classroom items that teachers usually purchase with personal funds, to procuring five book carts to house book club books, we have worked hard to improve the functionality at the middle school. Other items approved and purchased through the BMS FAC this year are:

- Teacher-identified equipment and supplies including math games for station work, bean bag chairs, a small trampoline for movement breaks, reading rulers, floor cushions for meeting groups, fidgets to help all students with individual needs, calculators, and a heavy-duty stapler for book-making.
- A smart TV in the book room for data discussion and collaboration among teachers.
- Two round, silver alchemy top, café-height tables for student discussion.
- High chair seating to go with the 7/8 social studies high-top table.
- Area rugs, milk crates, and chair pads for book club meeting spaces is ELA classrooms.
- A four-way volleyball net for the physical education volleyball unit.
- Fans for the 7/8 upper hallway to help circulate air in the hotter months.



FAC Committee continued

Over at Stormonth Elementary, proposed grants ran through the daily classroom and over to additional enrichment opportunities. One FAC-purchased item that many Stormonth students and families already benefited from recently were the brand-new wireless headset microphones used in "The Grunch" musical! This pair of microphones should last for years to come, and will be used across both schools for musicals, talent shows, concerts, and assemblies. We were also thrilled to purchase of all 3rd Grade "Market Day" supplies for the entire grade to make their products at school to sell at market day, allowing for the experience to be more equitable for all our third graders. Additional grants approved and purchased by the Stormonth FAC this year are:

- Wiggle Chairs and Weighted Turtles in two of our K5/1st grade classrooms to help improve student focus.
- Funds for the 4th grade "Snow Show" specialists' collaboration and an upcoming similar event for K5.
- * Restarting the Earth Ambassadors program with planting a kale garden in the courtyard, composting food waste, and recycling milk cartons.
- Two 4th grade classroom enrichment opportunities an archeologist speaking about Wisconsin effigy mounds and a virtual field trip to Fort Ticonderoga, NY via Google Meet.

Besides these amazing purchases the two FACs approved this year, the PTO was also able to stock up all our Stormonth classroom libraries and each ELA classroom over at BMS with muchneeded new books through the Scholastic Dollars earned from our recent book fairs! We started the school year with over \$6,900 in Scholastic Dollars and earned and additional \$5,900 from our fall book fair, for a grand total of over \$12,900 to spend. WOW! We divided this amount evenly between the schools, and the BMS team has spent over \$5,200 of our Scholastic Dollars on so many awesome new books for all our middle schoolers. Over at Stormonth, we've spent over \$3,000 in Scholastic Dollars bulking up classroom libraries, and look forward to purchasing more books from the teachers' wish lists at the upcoming spring book fair. And the best part about Scholastic Dollars is that they don't expire. So, any dollars not spent this school year can be spent next year!
