
On the program side, we raised \$4775.94 for the Teacher Appreciation Week and this

The Fund Allocation Committee (FAC) completed the majority of our work by March 1st, leaving \$1120 in Stormonth funds and \$2070 in Bayside funds, which will both roll over for use by next school year's FACs. Some of these remaining Bayside funds, approximately \$300 to \$400, will be spent off-setting rising costs associated with 8th Grade Promotion festivities and ensuring every 8th grader walks away with a yearbook in hand from this school year.
